One of my ongoing priorities, since becoming Chief Nurse for Adult Social Care in December 2020, has been to make sure the extraordinary efforts of social care nurses and the wider care workforce are recognised at a national level. Our shared experiences during the pandemic, which continues

The awards scheme is open to all roles across adult social care. There have been 86 Silver and 162 Gold nominations to date, recognising the amazing efforts and skills of colleagues across the sector. Those nominated include care assistants, registered nurses, social workers, education leads in learning disability services, supported housing, care homes and domiciliary care.

However, with 1.5 million people working across a wide range of settings, I know there are many more incredibly dedicated individuals out there who deserve recognition, including those from our ethnically and culturally diverse communities. We must all do more to encourage employers and managers to nominate and celebrate staff from all backgrounds.

We have recently streamlined the process to make nominating easier and faster. You can read the guidance criteria here and nomination forms can be accessed here. All nominees are considered by a panel of nursing peers and awards are made throughout the year.
